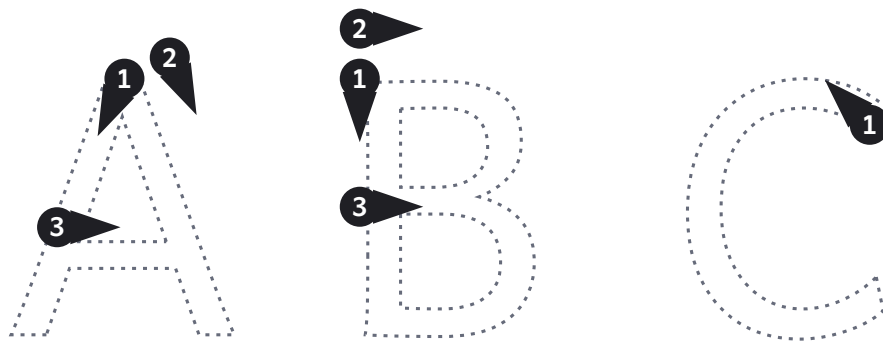


Letter Formation A-Z

26 worksheets - numbered starting dots and direction arrows



Every other alphabet worksheet prints a dotted letter and leaves the child to work out where to begin.

A child who starts an o at the bottom and goes clockwise will fight a, d, g and q for years, and nobody will spot it, because the finished letter looks perfectly fine on the page.

One numbered dot per stroke, one arrow per direction, and the strokes named in words underneath.

A4 - black ink only - ages 4-7

How to use this book

Two minutes of reading that saves a term of unpicking.

The three rules underneath every letter here

1. Capitals all start at the top. Every one of them.
2. Round letters go anticlockwise - o, a, c, d, g, q, e, s.
3. Letters are built top to bottom and left to right, in that order.

Watch the pencil, not the page

A letter drawn in the wrong order can look identical to one drawn in the right order. The only way to catch it is to watch the hand while it moves, which takes about ten seconds a letter and is the whole point of this book.

The one that matters most

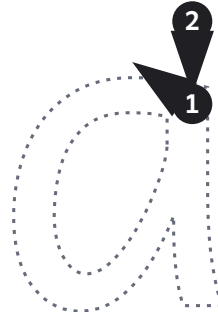
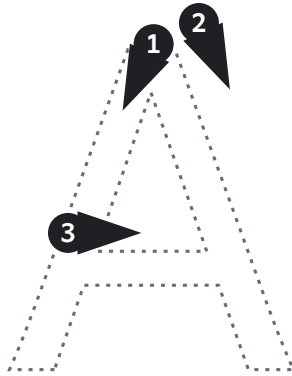
The anticlockwise o. It is the shape inside a, d, g and q, so getting it right once fixes five letters, and getting it wrong makes all five slow.

Schools differ, and that is fine

Joined-up schemes start several letters with a lead-in flick from the baseline, so the start dot moves. If the school teaches that, follow the school - the order of the strokes is the part that rarely changes.
